The Gramercy Park Block Association, has devoted much of its time and energy during the past year to aiding in the September 11th relief and recovery effort by organizing prayer vigils, toy drives, 'Neighbors Helping Neighbors' benefits, a nationwide children's support network called 'Kids Helping Kids', children's planting of a memorial garden outside the 13th Precinct, the installation of an eight foot memorial wall inside the Precinct called 'NYPD—You Make Us Proud' and an around-the-clock community effort by residents, merchants, restaurants and hotels to provide meals, shelter and critical supplies to rescue workers after they returned to the 13th Precinct Command Center from Ground Zero. In the months that followed, we continued to provide meals to the police officers of the 13th Precinct, Emergency Service Squad No. 1, NYPD Patrol Borough Manhattan South Personnel, Police Academy Cadets and Personnel, local Fire Department Units, Lexington Avenue Armory and Cabrini Hospital Personnel, the Medical Examiner's and Coroner's Offices, and The National Guard and rescue workers who came to New York from around the country. This year, as an extension of our commitment to this cause, the GPBA is honoring the memory of our local Police, Emergency Service Squad Officers, Emergency Medical Technicians and thirty-two local Firefighters, who lost their lives at the World Trade Center.
