

Gramercy Park - Update

Yesterday, Mike Boag and his crew from Boag Nurseries did a mass planting of Hosta, Astilbe and Viburnum in Gramercy Park. These are shade loving plants that were planted near the south gate.

A six foot Holly tree was planted in the same area as a backdrop for the underplantings which are the Hosta, Astilbe, and Viburnum.

We then transplanted the Forsythia from the center of the Park to the west side.

Thanks to generous donations from some of our families, we are now considering a large London Plane, Pin Oak or White Oak tree to replace the Maple that recently fell in the center of the Park.

We are also looking for a flowering cherry tree and a Yellow Magnolia.

This Friday (rain or shine), Bartlett Tree Experts will do deep root fertilization (nutrients for the plants) to all the trees and shrubbery throughout the Park.

For you safety, the Park will be closed whenever trucks and equipment are being used in the Park. A sign will appear on the Park fence.
